

Need help? Here's how to make a request

The mission of WELS Christian Aid and Relief (CAR) is to reflect Christ's compassion to souls who are suffering as the result of disasters or other hardships.

We carry out this mission through three main activities: disaster relief, humanitarian aid, and personal relief grants. Let's learn a little more about personal relief grants.

When a member or a prospective member of a WELS congregation is going through a medical or financial crisis—a crisis too big for the local congregation to handle alone—WELS CAR stands ready to assist. The process starts with the congregation's pastor. We ask that WELS members not contact WELS CAR directly, but instead work through their pastor. The pastor knows his people and their needs and can vet potential requests to see if the assistance of WELS CAR is needed. The pastor then contacts the director of WELS CAR, Pastor Dan Sims, to start the process. Pastor Sims offers guidance and direction and helps with the necessary paperwork. Together they come up with a plan by which the congregation and WELS CAR can provide appropriate assistance to the individual or family in need.

Over the years, it has been our privilege to partner with many congregations to help members in need. We have helped with the purchase of accessible vans and used cars. We have helped provide food, fuel, and clothing. We have helped put new roofs on homes. We have helped pay medical bills and utility bills.

Do you need assistance? Do you know of someone in your congregation who could use some help? If so, please reach out to your pastor and he will reach out to us. We'd be happy to partner with your congregation to share the compassion of Christ.


