Overall student indebtedness has experienced a substantial drop per student from 2014-15 to the present school year from \$27,406 to \$24,717.

WLS is expanding its reach with God's Word into many areas of the world. Prof. Bradley Wordell is now serving as the world mission seminary professor. The Joint Mission Council, together with the WLS administration, requested that an international recruitment director be called to the Seminary to meet the expanding needs of international mission fields.

A Workload and Mission Committee was established to evaluate the workload of WLS professors given the additional responsibilities they have assumed.

Martin Luther College

MLC serves over 1700 students on its campus and through online courses and webinars.

Student indebtedness is below the national average. Also, MLC students are faithful in repaying student loans—reflecting the faithfulness of Christ. "To God be the glory for this Christian witness."

Luther Preparatory School

LPS celebrated 150 years of training church workers on the Watertown campus. Sixty percent of 2016 graduates have decided to enroll at MLC in the fall.

Refurbishment of the LPS chapel, built in 1955, will be complete by June 30. Plans are being considered for a new music auditorium to replace the current auditorium. If this plan is followed, the current auditorium, built in 1912, will be returned to its old original use as a gymnasium.

Michigan Lutheran Seminary

On average over the last decade, 42% of MLS graduates have continued their training for public ministry at MLC.

The MLS Foundation is committed to providing \$100,000 per year to the student financial aid fund beginning with the 2017-18 school year.
